


Scottish Property Federation Monthly LBTT Update – May 2019

- Total Land and Buildings Transaction Tax (LBTT) revenue in May 2019 stood at £50.2m, up £1.1m (2%) on April's total and £9.6m (24%) up on the same month in 2018.
- Residential LBTT revenue rose in May to £23m, this is up against both April's total and the total in May 2018, by £2.5m (12%) and £3.7m (19%) respectively.
- Non-residential LBTT revenue in May totalled £13.9m, a fall of some £2m (-13%) on April's total but a rise of £0.3m (2%) on the same month in 2018.
- At £13.4m, **ADS** revenue in May 2019 was the highest monthly total since the tax was introduced in 2016, rising by £0.7m (6%) on April's total and £5.7m (74%) on the same month in 2018. This substantial year-on-year increase is likely a result of the ADS rate increase in January (from 3% to 4%) and transactions rebounding following the effect of forestalling before the rate rise. We expect that a sizable proportion of this ADS revenue will be repaid to taxpayers over the next 18-month period. Since ADS was introduced, some 21% has been reclaimed.
